

BRIAN UHL SCHOLARSHIP

The Brian Uhl Scholarship was established through a generous gift to the Nashville State Community College Foundation. This scholarship was created to expand access to higher education by providing flexible financial support to students pursuing an Associate Degree or Technical Certificate at Nashville State Community College.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$1,000 per academic year, depending on available funding.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30th each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process.
- Must have a family adjusted gross income of \$36,000.00 or less.
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of twelve credit hours.
- If an applicant is a first-time freshman, applicant must have a minimum 3.0 high school grade point average.
- If applicants has previously completed college-level coursework, applicant must have earned a 3.0 cumulative grade point average.
- Must be in good academic standing and meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements as defined by federal Title IV programs.

To remain eligible for continued scholarship support, students must continue to meet the initial criteria and also:

- Maintain a minimum semester GPA of 3.5, including remedial and developmental coursework, for each semester the scholarship is received.
 - If a student's semester GPA falls below 3.5, the student will be granted a one-semester probationary grace period.
 - During the grace period, the student must raise their semester GPA to at least 3.5.
 - If the GPA does not return to 3.5 or higher by the end of the grace period, the student will become ineligible to receive scholarship funds in the following semester.
- Successfully complete at least twelve credit hours each semester to qualify for disbursement in the following term.
- Re-enroll in a minimum of twelve credit hours for the upcoming semester.
 - Final Semester Exception: Students who are in their final semester and require fewer than 12 credit hours to graduate may continue to receive scholarship support. In such cases, the scholarship award will be prorated based on the number of credits required for graduation.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
