

NSCC FOUNDATION AMBASSADOR SCHOLARSHIP

The Nashville State Community College Foundation Ambassador Scholarship is made possible through the generous support of NSCC faculty and staff, local businesses and corporations, private foundations, individual supporters, and members of the Nashville State Foundation Board of Trustees. Created to expand access to higher education, this scholarship provides flexible financial support for up to four (4) students selected to serve as Ambassadors representing Nashville State Community College.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$1,000 per academic year, depending on available funding. Recipients are selected by the Welcome Center staff.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30th each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process.
- Applicants are selected through an interview process conducted by the NSCC Admissions team.
- To remain eligible for the Spring disbursement, students awarded the NSCC Foundation Ambassador Scholarship in the Fall must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 and re-enroll for the following semester.
- Recipients must sign a Code of Ethics, follow the Student Code of Conduct, and actively participate in Student Life events and meetings.
- Each semester the scholarship is awarded, recipients are required to complete 60 service hours. As official representatives of the college, Ambassadors will support both on- and off-campus events, including orientations, campus tours, prospective student meetings, and graduation ceremonies. Failure to fulfill the service hour requirement by the end of the semester will result in loss of eligibility for future scholarship disbursements.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
