

DR. WALLACE WILSON SCHOLARSHIP

The Dr. Wallace Wilson Scholarship supports students who demonstrate financial need and academic merit while pursuing a degree or certificate in Architectural Engineering Technology, Civil and Construction Engineering Technology, Civil Engineering, or Mechanical Engineering. Established in honor of longtime Nashville State professor Dr. Wallace Wilson, the scholarship is funded through the generosity of alumni, friends of the College, and industry partners committed to supporting future engineering and technology professionals.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$2,000 per academic year, depending on available funding.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30th each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process.
- Must be pursuing an Associate Degree at Nashville State Community in Architectural Engineering Technology, Civil and Construction Engineering Technology, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, and Civil and Construction Engineering Technology.
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours.
- Must have and maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5.
- Must be in good academic standing and meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements as defined by federal Title IV programs.

To remain eligible for continued scholarship support, students must continue to meet the initial criteria and also:

- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- Successfully complete at least six credit hours each semester to qualify for disbursement in the following term.
- Re-enroll in a minimum of six credit hours for the upcoming semester.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
