

ROBERT-WILLIAMS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Roberts–Williams Memorial Scholarship honors the lives and legacies of Ms. Lisa Sheucraft Roberts and Mr. Richard Williams, both dedicated faculty members at Nashville State Community College. Ms. Roberts taught in the Computer Information Systems program, and Mr. Williams served in Business Management Technology. Created to expand access to higher education, this scholarship provides flexible financial support for Computer Information Technology and Business students attending Nashville State Community College.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$1,000 per academic year, depending on available funding.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30th each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process.
- Must be pursuing an Associate Degree at Nashville State Community in a Computer Information Technology (CITC) or Business (BUSN) program.
- Must be a single parent.
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of twelve credit hours of college-level coursework in their program of study.
- Must have and maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0.
- Must be in good academic standing and meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements as defined by federal Title IV programs.

To remain eligible for continued scholarship support, students must continue to meet the initial criteria and also:

- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- Successfully complete at least twelve credit hours each semester to qualify for disbursement in the following term.
- Re-enroll in a minimum of twelve credit hours for the upcoming semester.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
