

JOHN E. MAYFIELD ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The John E. Mayfield Endowed Scholarship is funded by the Mayfield Endowment Fund established with the Nashville State Community College Foundation. This scholarship aims to attract and support students from Cheatham County, Tennessee.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$800 per academic year, depending on available funding.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30th each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must be a resident of Cheatham County, Tennessee.
- Must be enrolled in an Associate Degree program at NSCC, taking a minimum of six credit hours in remedial, developmental, or college-level courses. Priority will be given to students enrolled full-time (twelve or more credit hours).
- First-time freshmen must have a minimum high school GPA of 2.5.
- Current, returning, or transfer students must have completed at least twelve credit hours (including remedial/developmental coursework) with a minimum GPA of 2.5.
- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process.
- Must submit all required documentation to complete the financial aid file as requested by the NSCC Financial Aid Office.
- Awards are based on financial need as determined by the Financial Aid Office.
- Must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards as required for federal Title IV programs.

To remain eligible for continued scholarship support, students must continue to meet the initial criteria and also:

- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- Successfully complete at least twelve credit hours each semester to qualify for disbursement in the following term.
- Re-enroll in a minimum of twelve credit hours for the upcoming semester.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
