

# OSCAR LASKO ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Nashville State Community College Foundation Culinary Arts Scholarship is made possible through the generous support of NSCC Foundation donors. Created to expand access to higher education, this scholarship provides flexible financial support for Engineering, Computer Science, or other manufacturing related program students attending Nashville State Community College.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$1,250 per academic year, depending on available funding. Recipients are selected by the Welcome Center staff.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30<sup>th</sup> each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

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## **To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:**

- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process. Students will be considered for this scholarship if they have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) that is outside of the range for Pell Grant eligibility, but still have a defined need for financial aid as determined by the Financial Aid Office.
- Must be pursuing an Associate Degree or Technical Certificate in Engineering, Computer Science, or other Manufacturing related program.
- Must reside in Davidson, Dickson, Maury, or Williamson County.
- Must be enrolled in at least twelve credit hours.
- Must have and maintain at minimum of 2.5 GPA
- Applicants must be in good academic standing and meet satisfactory academic progress standards, as measured for federal Title IV Programs.

## **To remain eligible for continued scholarship support, students must continue to meet the initial criteria and also:**

- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- Successfully complete at least twelve credit hours each semester to qualify for disbursement in the following term.
- Re-enroll in a minimum of twelve credit hours for the upcoming semester.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
