

NSCC FOUNDATION OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT SCHOLARSHIP

The Nashville State Community College Foundation Endowed Scholarship is made possible through the generous support of Nashville State faculty and staff, local businesses and corporations, private foundations, individual supporters, and members of the Nashville State Foundation Board of Trustees. Created to expand access to higher education, this scholarship provides flexible financial support for OTA students attending Nashville State Community College.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$1,000 per academic year, depending on available funding. Recipients are selected by the Welcome Center staff.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30th each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process.
- Must be entering their last semester of the OTA Program.
- Must submit one faculty reference letter and one OTA peer reference letter.
- Must provide documentation of no unexcused absences or unexcused tardies in classes associated with the OTA program.
- Must provide documentation of no professional behavior concerns associated with the OTA program.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.

- Documentation of no unexcused absences or unexcused tardies in classes associated with the OTA Program (obtain from program coordinator).
- Documentation of no professional behavior concerns associated with the OTA program(obtain from program coordinator).

Applicants will be interviewed by OTA advisory board. Scholarship recipient will be notified via email no later than one week after interview with Advisory Board.
